President's Report: Angela

- Scholastic Book Fair Dollars/Points
 - Went well; sold as many books as we have previously, even with shortening to 3 days and only open in the morning and afternoon, and upper grades recess

Financials: Sara

- Voluntary Tuition update
 - Goal: \$55K, with corporate matching \$57,963! Biggest Fundraiser for the year; 104 donations
- \$229K in checking account; Sara is going to look to move some into money market
- Fall Scholastic Book Fair update
 - Spring sold \$8K, this Fair sold \$8,500, even with less days, shifts, volunteers; will stick with this format for future book fairs

Principal's Report: Amy

- Has been a busy month! Fun ahead with fall and winter holidays
- Art in Action supplies have been delivered, in the art room
 - Teachers have talked to parents to see who may be interested in helping with AIA; will have 1 lesson per trimester
 - Some teachers have shared they would like to work with a parent, some may want to do it on their own
 - Angela will be organizing the supplies and materials to be ready to go for the teacher or volunteers, if anyone would like to help

- Walk to School Day next Wednesday, need a volunteer to help put dots on a board that morning
- Earth Squad second grade is making a video for movie night
- Green Team is making a video for movie night also
 - Getting compostable liners for bins, having cornhole for \$1 at movie night
- Canopy for outdoor classroom (10x20) has been delivered; need stakes to hold it down
- Halloween Parade Monday, October 31 at 8:20; parents welcome to watch; teachers will work with parents on any in-class Halloween Fun
- Amy is going to reach out to Parents to build an ofrenda for Dia de los Muertos
- Indigenous People's Day school Monday, 10/10



Ms. Julia Update:

- Opera Together: Going well, Opera sent revised scripts earlier this week, so handed out final scripts; 29 kids participating; everyone has a named part; performance on November 29th at 9:30; primary parts are 5th and 4th graders; understudy for every part
 - Julia is filling out a grant for piano tuner, so will ask them; otherwise may look to PTO to fund (Sara found someone to tune the piano is \$180)

 - Working on a Documentation archive
 - Kristi is going to buy a new hose to replace the broken one
 - Murals from last year are completed; one more needs to be lacquered, and will be part of the next parent workday to hang up

 - We have enough money in budget to do this; all agreed to move forward with scheduling this
 - Danielle will move forward to book

 - o a teacher has asked PTO to help fund a field trip
 - need to determine how to allocate funds in future years; perhaps fund/student
- Lit club garage sale
 - Lit club likely not coming back in the same format this year, but
 3rd grade new curriculum could use new books
 - Ms. Kelly is happy to help quarter back the lit club garage sale;
 Sara happy to be #2 for garage sale
 - In order to work, need dumpster to work, and man in Montara helps to advertise
