# Principal's Report: Amy

- March Reading Madness was a huge success. We crushed last year's record of 82,000 minutes and set a new record of 109,000+ minutes. Thanks to the PTO for the pizza party!
- Our Kindergarten play was so much fun. Thanks to Genevra Putnam and Sherri Hall for bringing the hedgehog scientists, space flowers, and more to our stage.
- A power outage on March 22 caused the play to be postponed.
  - We were better prepared this time: lanterns with batteries were deployed before students arrived, the landline phone number was posted out front at drop-off.
  - Since then, walkie talkies have been placed in classrooms in case of power outages to ensure easier/faster communication between teachers and office staff.
  - CUSD is looking into purchasing another generator in case of future power outages. Unfortunately, it is difficult a time to secure one at this time.
- Mold testing was conducted at FV earlier this month. Please see the communication that went out to families this week. Mold spore counts were lower inside than the outside count. We continue to have air purifiers in every classroom regardless.
- Boundaries and school enrollment changes for 24-25 school year to be discussed at the board meeting tonight. These would hopefully result in an increase in student enrollment at Farallone View.
- After-school CAASPP test sessions are underway in preparation for state testing in May for grades 3-5. A letter went home to families today to provide additional information about the CAASPP assessment.
- Family Math Night Wednesday, April 14 from 6:30-7:30. Students in grades 4-5 will lead Math game stations for students in grades K-3.

## Financials: Sara

- We have \$219,000 in our checking account currently. Largest expenses still to come district 3rd & 4th qrtr bills & corrected 1st qrtr bill.
- Our Benevity Re-certification has been completed. This keeps us eligible for corporate matching programs through Benevity.
- Got both of our PayPal account out of Kelly's name and into mine.
- Created a Venmo Non-profit account for us. It required a PayPal Non-profit account for verification which we already had, BUT Venmo requires it to be tied to phone #, which is mine... so slightly nervous about the account transfer situation... Worst case scenario, I will have to print or download all transaction records & close my FOFPTO account and then a new board member can re-open with their number? I think. There doesn't seem to be any info available online about this. Will continue hunting it down.
  - They offered a free QRKIT for new non-profit accounts that has been ordered.
